Time is flying by! We have been busy in class preparing for Halloween. These are some of the classroom activities we have been engaged in working on together!

October saw us beginning our autumn activities and starting to learn the traditions of Thanksgiving. We have learned about autumn's seasonal changes by using our 5 senses and we continue to learn how animals prepare for winter. Our focus on Thanksgiving was that we should take time to say thank you to God for all of our gifts particularly our parents and families. We went on a fall walk and searched for many coloured leaves. We made autumn leaf rubbings and amazing leaf Creations inspired by the story—Leaf Man! We tried our first watercolour painting activity with our lovely Autumn leaves!

Alphabet Letters!

During October we also began learning about letters. Our letters of the week have included Aa, Ll, Ff, Tt and Hh. Each week, we read a book to highlight the letter sound, we sang and danced to songs emphasizing the letter sound and printing formation and we brainstormed many words that begin with these letters. We hope everyone can recognize these letters and hear the sound they say.

As part of our math program, we have been working on sorting objects in the classroom. We have sorted a variety of things based on one attribute such as shape, colour and size. We are also making patterns, which is another part of the math program. Leading up to Halloween, we have read the story and sang the song about the "5 Little Pumpkins". We also enjoyed the story "Go Away Big Green Monster" and created a monster of our own! We baked twice this month and have attached with this newsletter, the recipes for the pumpkin cookies and carrot/orange cookies. Many other activities have been taking place and I hope your child has been sharing these with you! Some tips for asking about their day may include some specific questions such as: What did you talk about in Carpet time? What center did you choose to play at? What activity did you make? Sometimes children will suddenly remember something about the day when you ask more specific questions that remind them of something special that happened!



November plans are underway! We will have some Remembrance Day activities. The majority of November will be spent working on a large "Not a Box" project. I am asking that each student bring a cardboard box to school by Wednesday, November 7th. This box should be large enough for the Child to sit inside! This box will be transformed into a car or vehicle by the students with some parent support. To help with

that, I am also asking for parents to send Cardboard or paper plates to become wheels or the steering wheel and any other items that you and your child think would be useful to decorate the inside or outside of the vehicle. Please remember that I have many students to help and the more the students do for themselves, the more they will feel responsible for the project and proud of it! We will wrap up this fun project with a "Drive-In" movie day on November 30.

Inclement Weather




