Each parent is invited to attend with their child so that you can celebrate together the amazing learning that has been taking place so far this year! The planned activities will allow you to witness the growth your child has made! You should allow yourself about an hour to work through the centers so that you don't feel rushed. On Wednesday, March 18th, my classroom will re-open at



3:00p.m. until 7:00p.m. so that parents can take this time to attend the Demonstration of Learning! I will be available for questions any time during the demonstration. The students will begin a large project in March about Canada! We will endeavor to focus on how we live here on the traditional land of Treat 6 and home of the Métis Nation of Alberta Zone 4. To help us understand that we live in Edmonton, where the Indigenous peoples ancestors have marked this territory for centuries, we will share what countries we have come from, to make this our home. We will look back and learn about how the Indigenous people survived on the prai-

ries and share some of the legends that have been passed down through the elders. Together, we will share some of the traditions of the Indigenous people and as well as traditions from other countries we have come from. We will look at

their similarities and differences. Our final activity will be a Cultural Snack shared together on Thursday, March 31st, during our regular class snack time. If you wish to send a snack for the class to sample, please do so, keeping in mind that students in our class have allergies to nuts and peanuts. Please include a list of the ingredients with the snack so that I can ensure the safety of all students.
